

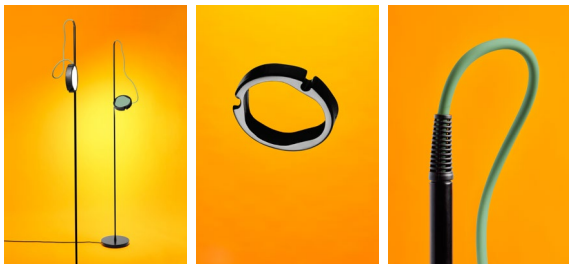

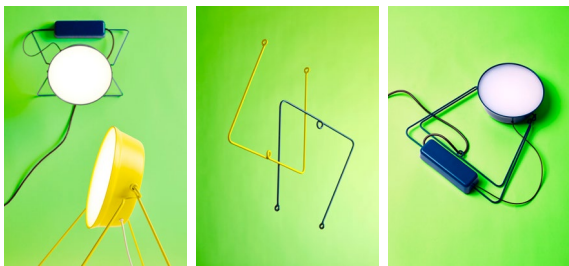
Tangente ECAL/Benoît Chastenet de Gery

A tribute to geometry, the Tangente lamp is made up of clean straight lines that centre on ball joints like tangents around a circle. It is easily oriented in all directions and comes as a floor lamp or desk lamp.



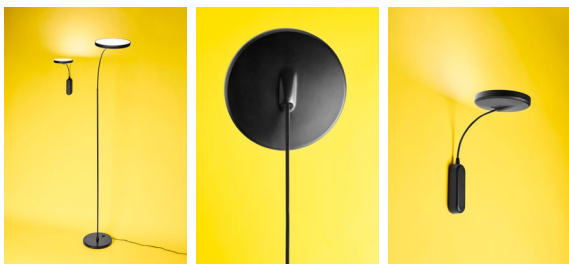
Padova ECAL/Aurélié Chèvre

This lamp's cleverness resides in its head overmoulded with rubber, which can be hung vertically, horizontally and at 45° angle. These three rational mounting possibilities enable Padova to create many different lighting atmospheres.



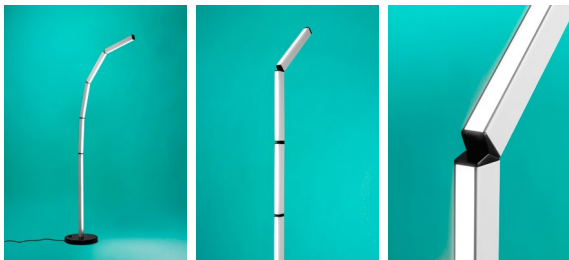

Based on a bent metal rod structure combined with a large spun-metal head, Darius plays on the contrast between lightness and heaviness to provide a smart foldable lamp. The lamp's movement is easy to control through a few simple intuitive gestures.

Inspired by deep-sea creatures, this lamp is fitted with a spring steel arm which delicately suspends the light. Relying on the springy property of the steel, Abysse features an ability to tilt the lamp head to one side or the other for two distinct lighting settings – as a reading lamp or floor lamp.

Anguis is a swivel lamp with a dual personality. When bent it offers a direct and intimate light, while upright it becomes more diffuse to provide ambient light across the room and up to the ceiling.
